

Another question asked by some in the security profession is "What is ASIS International?". It is the leading global security organization with over thirty-four thousand members from across the globe, making it the leader in the security industry.

ASIS International delivers standards and guidelines and study manuals in soft and hard copy. The Energy Sector and Physical Security

Lt. Col. Oswald J. Smiley, CPP, PSP Membership Chairperson Protecting the power grid with cutting edge physical security measures is critical to ensure power distribution.

esearch has indicated that there is enormous pressure on the utilities sector to remain resilient and secure themselves from the many different possible acts of sabotage. One such utility is the power or the energy utilities, which include power plants and power grids. Sub-stations, transmission and distribution infrastructure play an important role by keeping millions of businesses, public facilities and homes operating 24 hours per day. Should any of these important infrastructural networks be attacked, it could result in serious loss and damage and could cost that power utility company immense sums in compensation. According to the Jamaica Gleaner dated Saturday October 8, 2022, a well-known Security Consultant said that "utility companies and security providers must collaborate and increase the use of more technologybased equipment instead of relying on solely manpower".

Businesses have many competing priorities which put pressure on their budget. However, energy companies should provide cost-effective innovative solutions to properly secure their energy infrastructure. For example, an energy company could employ remote monitoring to secure and protect its physical infrastructure. Remote monitoring systems will allow the utility company to get an overall view of its entire network and to send timely response teams to distressed areas, thereby leading to shorter down time.

Protecting the power grid with cutting edge physical security measures is critical to ensure power distribution. If a saboteur can gain access to the control center of the power distribution system, the saboteur may be able to shut the system down with the intention for their co-conspirators to commit unlawful acts during the down time. Accordingly, it is critically important that such areas are secured with robust security measures. To this end, using technology, such as sensors, utility companies can be proactive and mitigate against all possible forms of attack on their systems.

The following information regarding the ASIS board certifications was extracted from the ASIS International website. ASIS International currently offers four board certifications namely:

The Certified Protection Professional (CPP)

which is the "gold standard" for security management professionals. This certification validates your knowledge in all areas of security management.

The Professional Certified Investigator (PCI)

This certification provides demonstrable proof of an individual's knowledge and experience in case management, evidence collection and preparation of reports and testimony to substantiate findings.

The Physical Security Professional (PSP)

This certification demonstrates your knowledge in physical security assessments, application, design and integration of physical security systems and implementation of security measures.

The Associate Protection Professional (APP)

This designation provides the first rung on the security manager's career ladder.

Further information on eligibility requirements and detailed steps for certification can be accessed on the ASIS International website under the heading certification from which the afore-mentioned information was taken.


I am imploring all our ASIS International Jamaica Chapter members and potential members who have not yet started the certification journey to do so and join the forty-four (44) certified members.

Bringing Down the House: Cyber Actors Breach Vegas Casinos

Caesars Entertainment disclosed a cyber incident to the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) that a may have compromised customer information but did not affect its physical properties.



Caesars identified the suspicious activity on 7 September approximately one week ago—which was the result of a social engineering attack on one of its outsourced IT vendors.

"After detecting the suspicious activity, we quickly activated our incident response protocols and implemented a series of containment and remediation measures to reinforce the security of our information technology network," the company said in its SEC form 8-k filing.
